The Johnstown Storywalk® Project

The Johnstown StoryWalk© Project at Stackhouse Park is captivating young minds while connecting them with nature. A StoryWalk© is a walking trail containing pages of a children's book mounted on posts along the path. Anne Ferguson, of Montpelier, VT created The StoryWalk© Project in collaboration with the Vermont bicycle & pedestrian coalition and the Kellogg Hubbard Library.

The Johnstown StoryWalk© launched in August with its first book, "Leaves" by David Ezra Stein. The storybook is changed often to encourage children to come back and explore. With books such as "Leaf Man" by Lois Ehlert, and "Bear Says Thanks", by Karma Wilson, young minds are engaged with nature along their walk. All books displayed will also be available at the Cambria County Library. The StoryWalk© is accessible to strollers and bicycles. While visiting, children are encouraged to explore nature within the surrounding trails and creeks.

Currently, "A Hat for Minerva Louise" by Janet Morgan Stoeke is being displayed. It is a fun story about a snow-loving chicken who looks for a hat to keep her warm while she explores the winter wonderland. The StoryWalk© book will be updated to "The Mitten" by Jan Brett in March with an event where copies of "The Mitten" will be given to participating families with children as a gift from the Johnstown Storywalk.©

Art Walk in the Park Summary

After only its third year, Stackhouse Park's Art Walk in the Park exceeded expectations with an estimated 2,000 attendees and over 60 craft and food vendors on August 28th. Vendors and visitors traveled from as far as Rochester, NY, and several vendors were sold out by 2 and 3 pm.

Creating a new tradition, the Park also held a 5k, Run the Park, on the morning of the event for the third consecutive year. A ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new Johnstown StoryWalk© was also held during the festival.

Thanks to local area businesses, the Park was able to run a successful advertising campaign and sponsor musicians for the event.
